

# Modern Implant Study Club

## Case Review Instructions

Study club participants are encouraged to present their cases for review, either in the form of a case report describing the methods and rationale regarding a successful or failed case, or a case review submission, which will allow participants and any invited speaker to comment on the case. In order to maximize the study club format and experience, please follow the checklist below. Not all cases will be approved for presentation or review, and ideally, cases should pertain to the topic of presentation, although exceptions will be made on a case by case basis.

- Case review form is completely filled out
- Models and photographs are properly labeled without any patient identifying information other than initials or first name only.
- Case outline included, which should include background of the case, patient and doctor expectations, treatment rationale, treatment complications, treatment outcome, and other pertinent information.
- For presentations, participant should be prepared to defend their decisions, or at least, provide an alternative technique or solution, if possible.
- Scientific references should be provided for lesser known procedures.
- If the procedure or solution is modified or unique, a scientific rationale should be provided.
- While thoroughness is appreciated, brevity is encouraged to allow other participants to present their cases.
- Case presentations will occur in the final hour of the study club.
- For most topics, a maximum of 4 case reviews will be allowed.
